ON YOUR OWN

- 2. Locate the following statements in the article and underline them
 - a. "Islam is very diverse, and it includes people with different belief systems."
 - b. "Hindu worshippers often visit the shrine alongside Muslim pilgrims."
 - c. "... many people see ISIS activities as a war between Muslims and non-Muslims."
 - d. "Terrorists acts are designed to cause fear, anger and distrust... For this reason, people of different faiths have to stand united against terrorism."
