Guessing Game: Who am I? An extension of "When should sports stars say goodbye?"

Sports has become extremely strenuous and demanding. Many champions are, therefore, retiring early in their careers. Read "When should sports stars say goodbye?" (page 23, What's Up May 2017) to find out more about this. Fortunately, there are easy ways to celebrate their achievements and remember them as role models. One way is to play a game like the one in this activity.

PREPARE FOR THE GAME

- Divide the class into four fairly equal groups A, B, C and D. Choose a leader for each group.
- The group leaders must explain the rules of the game to their groups. The leaders must also cut out the sports stars' name tags provided for this activity. There should be enough for each student to have one.
- Using sticky tape, each leader should stick a name tag on the back of every student in his/her group. No one should tell any student which sportsperson's name is stuck on his/her back.

PLAY THE GAME

- They student take turns to try and guess the names on their backs. When it is a student's turn, that student asks group members allowable questions such as "Which country am I from?", "Am I a sportsman or sportswoman?" and so on. such. Taboo questions like "Who am I?", "What is my name?", and "Does my name begin with ___?" are not allowed. Students are also not allowed to call out a name stuck on another student's back.
- 5. When a student correctly identifies the sportsperson, the tag is removed from that student's back and stuck onto his/her sleeve. The student continues to participate by answering questions.
- The game continues for 20 minutes. The group that correctly identifies the most sportspersons wins the game.
