Game: Have A Heart

An extension of "Teen wins Queen's praise for her life-saving campaign"

Millions of people around the world cannot lead active lives because organs in their bodies are not functioning properly. However, an organ received from a donor can make a huge difference. Read, "**Teenager campaigns for organ donation**," (page 15, *What's Up* January 2018) to learn more about how organ donation changes lives. Then, play a game to learn more about organ donation.

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Select a referee and a score keeper. Divide the rest of the class into two groups Group A and Group B. Each group elects a leader.
- 2. The referee reads a statement about organ donation from the provided Statement Sheet. The first team leader to raise his or her hand gets to answer. After saying whether the statement is true or false, the team should elaborate.
- 3. The score keeper gives two points for every correct answer, and deducts one point for every incorrect answer.
- 4. For every statement that is false, after a team has answered, the referee reads out the correct answer from the Statement Sheet.
- 5. The team with the highest points wins. However, every student can benefit from this game by learning more about organ donation.

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
