Game: Word Remix

An extension of "Meghan: from actress to princess"

Royal weddings are grand and fairy-tale like. Millions of people look forward to watching them and for many it is like living out a fantasy. The upcoming marriage of Prince Harry of Wales and Meghan Markle is no exception. Read "**Meghan: From actress to princess**" (page 7, *What's Up* April 2018) to find out more.

Instructions

1. Nominate a classmate to be the timekeeper and facilitator for this game.
2. Divide the rest of the class into five groups of about the same size. Each group must have sufficient writing materials.
3. From the facilitator's Word List, the facilitator will write one word on the board. The facilitator will then start the round by saying, "Go!", and simultaneously start the timer.
4. Each group will use the letters in the given word to make as many words as possible.
5. At the end of three minutes, the facilitator will say, "Stop!" Each group will check the words of another group and assign points according to the rules (see below).
6. Facilitator will then repeat steps 3–5 with the next word.
7. At the end of the game, the groups will total their points and the group with the highest total wins.

Rules

- Words must be of at least three letters. They must be found in the dictionary.
- When forming new words, letters can only be repeated as many times as it appears in the original word.
- No proper nouns are allowed.
- Points are awarded for correctly formed words according to the number of letters used in them. For example:

7 letters – 7 pts	6 letters – 6 pts	5 letters – 5 pts	4 letters – 4 pts	3 letters – 3 pts
