2	Sheep recognising the faces of their sheep friends even after being separated for two years.	
3	Elephants forming strong family groups.	
4	Capuchin monkeys knowing when they are receiving unequal pay.	
5	Macaques developing individual cultures.	
6	Chimpanzees keeping the peace.	
7	Rats giving up their favourite snacks to save a drowning friend.	
8	Rats giggling when being tickled.	
9	Fish using tools and octopus making decisions.
