In "The hidden story in these ancient ruins" (page 14, *What's Up* August 2018), the writer mentions that 19 landmarks were added to the list of World Heritage Sites. Do you know there are a total of 1,092 sites around the world? Five of them are described below. Draw arrows to match each description with its correct picture.

Descriptions

Angkor Wat is a temple complex in Cambodia. It is the largest religious monument in the world. There are five towers surrounded by a moat. The tallest tower stands in the middle.

Yosemite National Park lies in California, US. It has many waterfalls, soaring cliffs, free-falling waterfalls, and valleys. A great variety of flora and fauna can be found here.

Himeji Castle is the finest surviving example of an early 17th century Japanese castle. It is found in Hyogo Prefecture and has 82 buildings. It is built of wood with white walls and multiple roof layers.

In the centre of the Indonesian archipelago is a group of islands where giant lizards live. These are the Komodo Dragons, and their home is the Komodo National Park. A Komodo dragon can grow up to 3 metres long.

Stonehenge is perhaps the world's most famous prehistoric monument. It is found in southern England and comprises many huge upright stones laid out in a circle. The oldest is believed to be built 5,000 years ago.
