Word Wise

An extension of "Robbed! Thieves target Nepal's holy heritage."

Nepal's heritage being robbed is a terrible loss to the country and the world. Read "Robbed! Thieves target Nepal's holy heritage" (page 8-9, *What's Up* August 2018) to better understand the problem. Then, do the following exercise.

Instructions

1. Here is a summary of the problem and a suggestion for solving it.

The ⁽¹⁾ very old ⁽²⁾ man-made objects of historical significance that are being stolen from the stupas and monasteries are irreplaceable. These thefts are almost impossible to stop for several reasons.

Firstly, these valuables are kept at ⁽³⁾ <u>isolated</u> areas that cannot be easily monitored. It is also hard to tell the real ⁽⁴⁾ <u>worshippers</u> from the ⁽⁵⁾ <u>unwelcome</u> visitors, who are there not to view these ⁽⁶⁾ <u>holy</u> ⁽⁷⁾ <u>surviving objects of historical and religious importance</u> like ⁽⁸⁾ <u>original handwritten texts</u> and ⁽⁹⁾ <u>writings on rolls of material</u> or receive blessings, but ⁽¹⁰⁾ <u>to make away with</u> them. These treasures are not protected by security systems and are hence ⁽¹¹⁾ <u>susceptible</u> to theft.

Secondly, these items are worth (12) a lot of money on the (13) illegal market and will always attract thieves and robbers.

One way to prevent these thefts would be to gather all these priceless relics and keep them in a centralised location like a museum. These items can then be catalogued, and security systems can be installed to closely monitor these valuables. This will stop thieves like those who (14) illegally entered the stupas at Samdaling and who were (15) not discouraged by simple security measures like (16) sharp twisted wires. If facilities can be made for devotees to worship and make offerings, it would be a satisfactory solution for all.
