## STRONG Together An activity of "Spotting racial discrimination"

To carry out this exercise, you will have to stretch your imagination and use some wisdom as well. First, read the article "Spotting racial discrimination" (page 15, What's Up October 2018). Then, divide your class into six groups to work on this activity.

## **PART I: IMAGINE**

In your mind's eye, picture this. All the kids mentioned in the What's Up article go to a leadership camp. There, they examine big challenges in their everyday lives. The campers work in teams to develop action plans for team members. Suri, Teja, Roy, Olivia, Nita, and Greg land up on the same team! To their delight, they discover that their names together form the acronym "STRONG". Team STRONG decides the challenge they want to focus on is racial discrimination.

## PART II: DISCUSS

Help Team STRONG with its challenge. Revisit the six scenarios given in the What's Up article to refresh your memory. How can Team STRONG help its members heal from the hurts caused by these forms of racial discrimination? Jot down your ideas on the back of this handout. As a group, select the best of your ideas as a contribution to Team STRONG's planning. You may pick more than one good idea per child.
