An activity of "Earth's health depends on more than cute animals"

Read "Earth's health depends on more than cute animals" (page 16-17, What's Up March 2020).

A debate is a formal argument about a particular subject. In a formal debate, there are two teams. Each team presents its argument in a clear and organised way. Conduct a debate in class.

THE MOTION

That animal rights groups should continue to use animals that are adorable instead of "ugly" to help raise awareness about animal issues.

- 1. Split your class into two. One half will serve as Proposition, and the other half as Opposition. Proposition: your side says the motion is true. Opposition: your side says the motion is false.
- 2. Based on which side you belong in, discuss and fill in the following:

4. Next, select four speakers to be your side's debating team.

Speaker 2		Deliver argument 2. Challenge any point(s) that your opposing team has made
Speaker 3		Deliver argument 3. Challenge any point(s) that your opposing team has made
Speaker 4		Challenge any point(s) that your opposing team has made Summarise and conclude your team's arguments.

- 5. Conduct the debate. Have a time keeper: each speaker gets ten minutes.
- 6. As a whole class, have a conversation about what this experience meant to you.
