Flip Sides of a Coin

An activity of "Indonesia's volcanic attraction"

In the article "**Indonesia's volcanic attraction**" (page 12, *What's Up* August 2020), we can find many situations that seem to be at odds, and yet are connected.

PART 1: Form sentences with these phrases using the words 'yet' or 'but' as connectors.

e.g. Mountain climbing is exhilarating,	yet	terrifying.

PART 2

A dilemma happens when one finds it hard to choose:

- i) between two equally positive choices (e.g. choosing to work with only one of your two good friends for a paired project), or
- ii) between two equally negative choices (e.g. running in the rain and getting drenched, versus staying under the shelter and being late for an appointment), or
- iii) to do something positive, that would also result in doing something negative (e.g. telling a lie to cover up for a friend).
- 2. Have you ever been caught in a dilemma? Describe the incident to a friend.
- 3. Consider the following examples of mirror art.

Subject matter (objects used)	Artist A shows on the left and on the right. Artist B shows on the top and at the bottom.
