

- 1. Share from your experience instances where having "fiction" or even "prediction" in your perceptions resulted in conflict or misunderstanding.
- 2. Write a personal recount titled, "A Misunderstanding", inspired by the ideas you have gathered in your group. Some guidelines for writing a personal recount:
 - Narrate it in the first person
 - As it has already happened, in general, use the past tense.
 - Explore the narrator's thoughts and feelings about the event.
 - Usually, the events are described in chronological order i.e. the sequence in which they happened.
 - Use connectors to indicate time sequence
