Celebrate International Day of Forests! An activity of "Refugees help restore a forest"


Read "Refugees help restore a forest" (page 7, What's Up February 2022). Then, do this two-part activity to celebrate the International Day of Friendship (21 March).

Before Reforestation	After Reforestation


STEP B: ABOUT CIRCLES
