Ten Trees We Love

An activity of "Refugees help restore a forest"

"**Refugees help restore a forest**" (page 7, *What's Up* February 2022) shares about Rohingya refugees who are looking after a forest in Bangladesh. Here in Singapore, you can help to care for our trees, too. An important first step is to learn more about them!

AS A WHOLE CLASS

- 1. Divide your class into ten groups of about the same size.
- 3. Select one tree per group. You can do this on a first-come-first-served basis or draw lots. No two groups should have the same tree.

IN YOUR GROUP

- 4. Gather information about your group's focus tree. Start at NParks' "Know 10 Trees" page by clicking its name. You may also surf the internet for more information. All group members should actively help with this step.
- 5. Organise your facts and create a presentation of your key findings. You may use software such as PowerPoint slides or sheets of flip-chart paper. Your group may decide to appoint one writer and one artist/designer for your presentation.
- 6. Select a presenter for your group. Other members should support the presenter by saying encouraging words and offering suggestions. Your group may also have an assistant presenter to help with the PowerPoint slides or flip-chart paper.

AS A WHOLE CLASS

- 7. Take turns to present each group's findings to the class.
- 8. With your teacher's permission, share your slide printouts and/or posters with the rest of the school by displaying them in a common space such as at your school canteen.
