Kanom	Pak Chaem, Thailand	Samrith Petchkong : "When one thinks of kanom jeen noodles, one thinks of eating traditions of Thai people. Eating is a tradition that is as important as any to our national identity."

<u> </u>	Nuoro, Sardina	Paola Abraini : "This type of pasta is passed down from mother to daughter. It is still a family tradition, and we care a lot about keeping it in the family. There is no other pasta like it in the world."
"Nool Puttu" or rice thread	Bengaluru, India	Shanta : "Idiyappam is made with the love of mom. When I was a child, my mother and grandmother all used to prepare it. By seeing it, I learned."

My grandmother always cooked and brought us together around the table with her. It was very pleasant. Today I have children of my own, and homemade lapsha brings them joy."
