## Greenwashing

An activity of "Saudi Arabia's bold vision for a new city"

In "**Saudi Arabia's bold vision for a new city**" (page 11, *What's Up* May 2022), greenwashing is mentioned.

Greenwashing originates from the word "whitewashing", which means to make something appear better than it actually is. It is like repainting a building white, so that people believe it is newer than it is. This is done to gain favour with the public. However, it can be misleading and inaccurate.
