

# A Wheel of Ideas

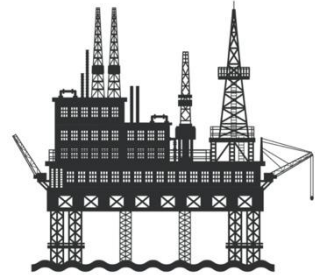
An activity of "Southeast Asia's youngest country"

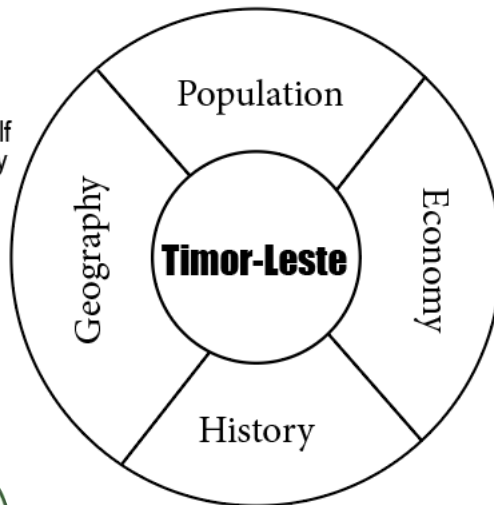
## EXAMPLE OF AN IDEA WHEEL



- 1.3 million people
- Many indigenous groups
- Tetun account for 1/4 of population
- Small communities of Hakka Chinese, Timorese Indian
- Official languages: Tetun, Portuguese
- Working languages: English, Bahasa Indonesia
- Religion: mostly Roman Catholic



- 15,000 sq km
- Comprises eastern half of Timor island; nearby islands of Atauro and Jaco; and Oecusse
- Has wide diversity of habitats, including forested mountains, marshlands, coastal swamps



- Extraction of oil reserves in the Timor Sea account for 80% of economy
- Second largest export is coffee
- Rural residents mostly fish, farm or do other agricultural work
- Tourism increasing recently



- Claimed by Portuguese and Dutch during the time of European colonialism
- Portuguese colony for more than 400 years
- Declared independence on 28 Nov 1975
- Invaded by Indonesia 9 days later
- Under Indonesia control for 24 years
- Held first free elections in 2001
- Regained independence in 2002
