Let's Get Punny An activity of "Recycling soap to help people in need"

Did you get the joke? In the article "Recycling soap to help people in need" (page 8, What's Up June 2022), the writer describes the soap recycling operation as "clean". The word "clean" here means "law-abiding". This is funny because we also know that the story's topic, soap, makes us clean literally!

This is an example of a **homographic pun** — a form of wordplay that uses the many meanings of a word for a humorous effect. You can find such puns everywhere, from classic poems to modern advertisements and headlines. Let's take a closer look at puns today!
