Plane Poetry An activity of "Tee & Boba".

Read "Tee & Boba" (page 28, What's Up March 2023). Boba is determined to make a "top secret aviation object" — in plain words, an aircraft. Boba is not the only one fascinated by airplanes. - 1. Make a trip to a Viewing Mall at Singapore Changi Airport. The Viewing Malls are at Terminals 1, 2, and 3. Bring with you some writing and/or drawing materials.
- 2. Chose a quiet spot where you can sit and observe the planes closely. Give yourself some time to watch the planes and make notes (in point form) and sketches.
