## A Mother's Day Song

An activity of "It sounds silly but it is now the world's most famous poem".

Read "It sounds silly but it is now the world's most famous poem" (page 20, *What's Up* April 2023). John Cooper Clarke's poem, "I Wanna Be Yours", is rich with similes and metaphors. Follow his example. With Mother's Day around the corner, explore using similes and metaphors to express your appreciation for your mother or a mother figure. Work in small groups for the second part of this activity.

A **simile** is a comparison between two things. It uses the words "as" or "like". For instance, "Her hair was <u>as</u> soft <u>as</u> silk.", or "The moon was <u>like</u> a silver coin in the sky.".

A **metaphor** is a comparison between two things that does not use the words "as" or "like". For instance, "Her hair was silk.", or "The moon was a silver coin in the sky.".

c) Which is your favourite simile or metaphor in the poem? Explain why you like it.
