The Holland Code (RIASEC) Test is an assessment tool, designed by psychologist John L Holland. Doing the test can help people explore their career options that align with their interests and personality. It broadly categorises careers into six main types — Realistic, Investigative, Artistic, Social, Enterprising, and Conventional.

Here are some of the more common career paths that fall into these six categories.


Realistic	Carpenter, electrician, landscaper, mechanic, plumber, farmer, pilot, driver, gardener, police officer, surgeon, dentist, firefighter, vet.
Investigative	Archaeologist, zoologist, medical researcher, astronomer, meteorologist, pharmacist, nutritionist, computer programmer.
Artistic	Musician, actor, writer, artist, photographer, filmmaker, fashion designer, culinary artist, interior designer, choreographer.
Social	Teacher, counselor, social worker, psychologist, therapist, chiropractor, fitness trainer, community organizer, nurse, doctor.
Enterprising	Entrepreneur, salesperson, marketing specialist, real estate agent, stockbroker, advertising executive, investment banker, CEO, lawyer.
Conventional	Accountant, lawyer, data analyst, bank teller, bookkeeper, statistician, librarian, auditor, compliance manager.
