Feedback Etiquette

An activity of "My Stuff: Umbrella".

How to receive feedback:

- Listen to the feedback carefully.
- Be open to suggestions for improvement.
- If the feedback is not clear, ask for clarification politely.
- Even if the feedback is not usable, be gracious and acknowledge the feedback.
- At the end, thank all who participated in giving feedback.

How to give feedback:

- Point out what you like about the group's umbrella idea.
- Give feedback that is helpful. Be specific.
- Be polite when making suggestions on what could be improved on.
- Focus on the group's idea, not on what they are like as a group.
