


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## More Precious than Silver


An activity of "Baby Boom at the Zoo".



1) List five interesting facts about the animal you picked.



2. Search for images from the web that display the animal from at least three different angles — the front, side, and back.





3. Imagine you have been commissioned to create exquisite silver ornaments for the zoo's fund-raising drive. The theme is "Silver Linings: Safari's Precious Hope". Using your sketches as a guide, mould some aluminium foil into the shape of your selected animal to make small silver ornaments (sculptures) for the zoo. Watch this video to see how a simple sheet of aluminium foil is transformed into a beautiful animal.
