Fact or Opinion?

An activity of "Why Denmark's new queen is beloved in Australia".

In almost every story you read, you will come across facts and opinions.

A fact is a thing that is known or proven to be true. Example: *The National Day of Singapore is on the 9th of August.* This is a fact because it can be proven that Singapore's national day is on 9 August.

An opinion is a view or judgment about something. It is based on thoughts, beliefs, or feelings. Example: *The National Day of Singapore is the most exciting holiday of the year.*This is an opinion because it cannot be proven to be true for everybody.
