An extension of "Female guardians of the forest"



STEP 2: Before drawing a comic strip, artists usually do a storyboard. This is where you decide what goes into each panel of the comic strip. Using the points under "What happened?" on Page 1, plan your comic by jotting down the key point of each panel and adding a simple sketch below. The first one has been done as an example.

STEP 3: Now, it is time to get creative! Using your storyboard as a guide, draw your comic strip on a fresh piece of paper.

Some tips

- You do not have to stick to the layout used in the storyboard. Some panels may be bigger. You may even omit the outline of the panel!
- Make your comic livelier by adding some dialogue in speech bubbles. For example, what might the villagers say when they see the muddy stream?
- Consider how much of a scene to show. For example, instead of showing a villager's whole body, you might draw only his face — this lets you show his expression more clearly.
- Use visual sound effects called onomatopoeia (see below) for impact.
