Homonyms: Same-same but Different

An activity of "Tee and Boba".

Read the comics, "Tee and Boba (page 28, *What's Up* April 2025). In the comics, Tee and Boba go on different adventures while staying in the same place. The same can happen with words that are homonyms. A homonym refers to a word that sounds the same or is spelled the same but has more than one meaning. Examples are "not" and "knot", "bark" (of a dog) and "bark" (of a tree). Work in pairs to have fun with homonyms.
